A note from our Principal Mr Hacker

Dear parent/carer

Welcome to our latest newsletter. It's now the end of the Spring term. The clocks go forward an hour on Saturday night and we can look forward to longer days when we return after Easter. I want to wish everyone a peaceful couple of weeks, ready for our start of the Summer term on Monday 15th April.



From the first day back after Easter, we will be resetting expectations of uniform standards and it's worth reminding all of our families of some of the main reasons for having the uniform in the first place. In short, our uniform:

- is practical and smart
- is fair and makes students feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance and reduces peer pressure to dress in 'designer' fashions;
- promotes a sense of pride in the academy;
- Is good value for money;
- promotes a sense of community and belonging towards the academy;
- can assist identification of strangers on school premises

Most of our students consistently wear their uniform with pride, however there have been increasing numbers of pupils who are not wearing it correctly and this needs to be addressed immediately. The main areas of concern are inappropriate footwear (mainly trainers), inappropriate jewellery, rather than the single pair of studs and missing items such as a blazer.

Please ensure that your child has all the correct items of uniform, including plain black school shoes. We realise that some manufacturers market trainer style shoes as 'school shoes', but the easiest test is 'can they be polished' and are they an obvious shoe that cannot be mistaken for a trainer.

Wearing the right uniform is a basic expectation of attending Co-op Academy Walkden and we therefore need it to be right, rather than it becoming a focus of unnecessary attention. We will be checking on uniform standards every day, to ensure that everyone is treated fairly and of course if expectations are not being met, then we will need to issue consequences. Your support with this is greatly appreciated and as always, if you are experiencing hardship which is presenting a challenge to buying any item of uniform, we can help. Interview with Amelie

We like to celebrate the success of all students and this month we interviewed one of our Year 10 students Amelie. Amelie has achieved huge success in her swimming career, earning the position of 8th in the world with the British Olympic Trials on the horizon for April.



What does a day in the life of Amelie look like?

I wake up at 4,40am,have breakfast (porridge),and go to morning training (where I cover approximately 5km in the pool). I then come home and have my second breakfast before school, walk to school, walk home school, make a quick snack,go swimming training again (2.5 hours in the pool, sometimes the gym). I usually have Wednesday evenings and most weekends, when not competing, free for my own time to do normal teenage girl things, like shopping and time with friends.

When did you first discover a love for swimming?

My mum sent me to swimming lessons as a kid, I was then put in an academy and from there didn't stop. I had the option of continuing with dance, football, gymnastics or swimming...but I chose to follow my older sister into the swimming world, she was really good and I wanted to be like her! My sister still swims so it's a family thing!

Which 3 words would you use to describe yourself?

Determined, Upbeat, Competitive

Who is your ultimate idol? (sports or otherwise)

Michael Phelps (Most decorated swimmer ever) and Katie Ledeky (She has won seven Olympic gold medals and 21 world championship).

Do you have any interesting competition day rituals?

I have a lucky swimsuit but I can't wear it for competition anymore so it is going to be framed and put on the wall.

How do you manage your swimming schedule and school life?

It can be quite hard and I do struggle to get the balance right. I sometimes do my homework in the car on the way to training or to events. I have to dedicate a lot of time to analysing my health and nutrition and receiving feedback from professionals who work with me. I do try to keep up to speed with my school work and I know that in year 11 that will be a little bit harder.

What is the best piece of advise you have ever been given?

Do or do not, there is no try...Grandad

What is the next goal you re working towards?

It was a huge achievement to be selected for team GB. Maybe a European junior medal in July, I have qualifiers for this in April. My long term goal is the Olympics
